- The fatality rate is 2%
- The strain virulent and effect everywhere globally
- The risk to some individuals will be higher than others - Specific medical conditions
- The NHS will be overwhelmed. It's important to reduce transmission to slow the critical cases going into the NHS.
- Absence is 20-50%
